DSL**** *Fahrenheit 9/11*

Michael Moore has transformed the industry creating an unseen energy for documentary films. No documentary has ever been viewed as much as his *Fahrenheit 9/11*. In the first weekend, it outgrossed the top moneymaking documentary in history, *Bowling for Columbine*, another film of his. Even though Moore showed his bias with his choices, the story is compelling.
